Form TR-WM-140 https://datcp.wi.gov/Docu men ts/TR-WM-140.pdf Aboveground shop-built tanks being moved from one location to another, even to another location within the same facility, must meet the requirements of <u>Wisconsin Administrative Code § ATCP 93.400(6)</u>. This section does not apply to tank wagons, tank vehicles, and other mobile tanks, which are covered under <u>Wis. Admin. Code § ATCP 93.610</u>.

To move an aboveground shop-built tank, owners must comply with the following requirements:

- Submit plans to DATCP or the authorized agent for review, as specified in <u>Wis.</u> Admin. Code § ATCP 93.100(2).
- If the tank is being relocated to a property with a different street address, tank
  registration form <u>TR-WM-118</u>, and part A of the tank- system service and closure
  assessment report form <u>TR-WM-140</u>, must be completed by a certified
  remover/cleaner and submitted to the department for the former location.
- The tank must be installed at the new location by a certified Aboveground Tank Installer.
- Submit the tank installation inspection checklist form <u>TR-WM-120</u>, completed by a certified tank system inspector.
- If the tank contained Class I liquids, it must be rendered free of flammable vapors before the move and maintained vapor-free until placed into service at the new location.
- Conduct tank pre-operational testing and inspection in accordance with PEI RP200 chapter 14.
- A certified tank system inspector must conduct an inspection before placing the tank into operation.
- Continue to follow the inspection schedule in STI SP001 that was established at the former location.
