

The research team sent the 2019 Census survey to public, private, and charter SFAs as well as residential childcare institutions in the 50 States, Washington D.C., and U.S. territories.


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


Farm to school participation is defined as having done at least 1 of 30 specified farm to school activities primarily related to procurement, promotion, or education in SY 2018-2019.






WI SFAs: Participating Grades in Farm to School Activities








WI SFAs: Policies in Support of Farm to School Activities






WI SFAs: Definition of Local






WI SFAs: Top 5 Education and Promotion Activities Done






WISFAs: Procurement Approaches

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
