

~Population of 16,644 ~Roughly 50% forested, 50% agriculture ~415 miles of streams (294 mi. trout stream) ~1,034 farms, averaging 204 acres ~Cattle- 31,500 Swine- 7,000 Poultry- 42,500


FARMLAND PRESERVATION PROGRAM

~Partnering with NRCS on the project

~Goal was to use EQIP funds increase the use of cover crops on our corn/soybean ground

~Low cost, relatively "hands-free" to producers

~Generated a Conservation Fund



~Very limited well testing records in Crawford

~Our goals were to provide well tests to 100 residents at no charge and to raise overall awareness of the importance of regular well testing


LAND CONSERVATION MERGED WITH ZONING/ SANITATION IN 2017

~Had to create an inventory of systems in the county (~4,600 systems) ~Digitizing paper files and linking them to a specific parcel

~Re-enrolled in the Wisconsin Fund program
~2018-19= \$117,000 in state funding, 18 systems
~2019-20= \$179,000 allocated, 37 systems installed, 20 to be installed

~We are hoping that WI Fund will be renewed for 2 more years (or longer!)







~Conversion to row-crops and more and more livestock housed at fewer operations creates challenges in Crawford County due to our geography/ geology

- ~Heavy rainfall events on our steep slopes
- ~Increase in non-resident landowners makes building relationships difficult

~Current farm economy
