2021-23 GOVERNORS BUDGET FOR CLIMATE CHANGE IN AG

- Increase County Land Conservation Staffing
 - Climate change assessment and strategy development
 \$1.8 million/yr
 - Overall staffing grant increase of \$3.6 million in 2021-22, \$3.708 million in 2022-23
- Regenerative Ag and Carbon Sequestration Grant Program
 - \$370,000/yr for a pilot program that studies the feasibility of a carbon market covering the state
 - Provide grants to producers and producer-led groups who participate in a carbon market pilot program

- Soil Health Incentives
 - Provide funding and 1.0 FTE at the State
 Laboratory of Hygiene for soil health testing
 - Increased funding for Producer Led Program to \$1 million/yr
 - Grazing Program -
 - Grazing education and training (no positions)
 - Grants for grazing/conservation/regenerative ag \$320,000/yr



OTHER CONSERVATION FOCUSED BUDGET AND PROGRAMMATIC ITEMS

Nutrient and Manure Management

- Biodigester Planning Grants \$250,000/yr
- Nitrogen Optimization Grants -\$500,000/yr

Water Stewardship Certification Program

- \$250,000/yr in grants to producers for Alliance for Water Stewardship Certification
- 0.5 FTE at DATCP to administer

• Related -

- Farmland Preservation Planning Grant funds able to use unallocated dollars for implementation of county farmland preservation programs
- Increased bonding authority for cost-share projects such as grassed waterways, manure storage, streambank stabilization, etc.
- Public Service Commission reevaluate the appropriate social cost of carbon every two years, and consider it when determining issuance of construction certifications.



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
