- Benchmark for Agronomy Professionals





# Becoming a CCA: Certification



- 1. Pass two comprehensive exams (International and Local Board)
- 2. Meet the experience requirements

two years of experience with at least a Bachelor of Science Degree in an agronomy related field three years of experience with an Associates Degree in an agronomy related field four years of experience with no degree

3. Apply for the CCA Credential

Document education and crop advising experience (Including transcripts and supporting references) Sign and agree to uphold the <a href="CCA Code of Ethics">CCA Code of Ethics</a> (Included in application)

4. Once Certified: Earn 40 Continuing Education Units every 2 years and pay membership fees each year
