CONGRATULATIONS on completing Step 1 of the licensing requirements for obtaining a Bulk Milk Weigher and Sampler license. The temporary license that you received today will allow you to weigh and sample milk for the next 90 days. After those 90 days your temporary license will no longer be valid unless you have completed Step 2 of the licensing process.

Step 2 of the Bulk Milk Weigher and Sampler licensing process will be to successfully complete an on-farm licensing inspection, or if you will be an in-plant sampler only, an in-plant licensing inspection, with one of our DATCP Food Safety Inspectors. It is your responsibility to schedule the appropriate in-plant or on farm licensing inspection, within the next 90 days after completing the examination. Please contact your Bulk Milk Tanker operator or Dairy Plant for Food Safety Inspector contact information. The inspector is to be contacted no less than 14 days prior to your licensing inspection.

Once the Food Safety Inspector has notified our office that you have successfully completed your on-farm inspection, DATCP will issue your Full Status Bulk Milk Weigher and Sampler license.
