

Reporting a Suspected Foreign Animal Disease

If you suspect a foreign animal disease (FAD), call one of the numbers below to report the concern.



Potential Signs of a FAD:

- Unexplained deaths
- High fevers
- Sudden increase in rates of abortion
- Blisters or ulcers in the mouth, or on the nose or teats
- Blisters or ulcers on the coronary band, bulbs of the heels or in interdigital spaces, and/or unexplained lameness
- Profuse salivation
- Unexplained neurological signs (e.g., ataxia, seizures, blindness)
- Unusual hemorrhages
- Severe diarrhea
- Unusual maggots, ticks or other parasites

After the call, please take the following precautions:

- Stay on the premises until a FAD diagnostician contacts you.
- Make sure no animals enter or leave.
- If you must leave the premises, extensive cleaning and disinfection of
 your outerwear, equipment and vehicle is required. Discuss requirements
 with the FAD diagnostician. At minimum, you must discard or thoroughly
 clean and disinfect equipment used; seal your outerwear in double bags
 and disinfect the surface of the outer bag; scrub and disinfect outer foot
 coverings/boots; and wash the interior and exterior of your vehicle.
- Do not go to other farms or have contact with other animals until you have showered and changed into clean clothes.
- Discard or launder and disinfect all clothing and equipment prior to reuse.
