Dear Feed Manufacturer, Labeler and Distributor:

Thank you for your interest in becoming part of Wisconsin's commercial feed industry. Enclosed is a packet that contains the required application and reports needed to distribute, label or manufacture commercial feed in Wisconsin. The packet also contains other supporting information to assist in the completion of the required documents.

You should become familiar with and follow the enclosed [Wisconsin Commercial Feed Law](#) (Sec. 94.72, Wisconsin Statutes) and the [Wisconsin Commercial Feed Rule](#) (ATCP 42, Wisconsin Administrative Code). Additionally, you can access both from our Web site: (<http://datcp.wi.gov/Farms/Feed/index.aspx>) or call 608/224-4537 and request copies. Some key areas include:

Commercial Feed License Application

An annual license is required for any person who manufactures, labels or distributes commercial feed in Wisconsin. There is a license fee of \$25 per year--the license year runs from March 1-February 28/29. Complete one form for the principal mailing site and each Wisconsin site where feed is manufactured, labeled or distributed (**see definition on General Information sheet**). If all sites of manufacturing/labeling are outside Wisconsin, then a single payment of \$25 is required.

Labels

Labels must conform with Section 94.74 (2) Wis. Stats. and ch. ATCP 42.04 (Wis. Adm. Code). New applicants send copies of your product labels with your application and existing licensees send copies of labels for new products only. The issuance of a commercial feed license does not in any way mean that the department finds the commercial feed labels are in compliance with either state or federal commercial feed laws.

General Information Sheet

This form provides definitions and information on commercial feed categories.

Exempt Buyer List

Exempt Buyers pay the inspection fee on all commercial feed they distribute. Persons selling commercial feeds to Exempt Buyers may claim an inspection credit for that feed. See Section 94.72 (6) (f), Wis. Stats. for more information.

Social Security Form

Wisconsin law requires that we collect the social security number of each individual applying for a license. See enclosed form #ARM-356, [Request for Social Security Number \(SSN\)](#) for details.

Tonnage Report

The inspection fee is \$0.25 per ton for commercial feed tonnage sold or distributed into/within Wisconsin from January through December. The licensee who first sells or distributes a feed in/into Wisconsin is responsible for the inspection fee, unless he distributes it to an Exempt Buyer. Credit can be taken for pre-paid tonnage. The tonnage report form will be mailed with a commercial feed license renewal application in January of each year.

Sales of less than one ton are considered equal to one ton and require the \$0.25 per ton tonnage fee. The inspection fee for feed distributed during the year will be collected during next year's license renewal period.

For manufacturers/distributors who have not sold or distributed feed in Wisconsin, your tonnage fee will be zero. You will still need to complete and return a tonnage report form.

The issuance of a commercial feed license does not preclude the department's request for further information or taking action in order to secure compliance with the commercial feed rule and laws of Wisconsin.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Wisconsin Commercial Feed License Application and Inspection Fee Tonnage Report

A. DEFINITIONS

(Section 94.72, Wis. Stats., and, ch. ATCP 42, Wis. Adm. Code)

"**Manufacture**" means to mix, blend, process, package or label commercial feed.

"**Process**" as defined by the Association of American Feed Control Officials means: de-hulling, extraction, extrusion, heat-processing, irradiating, kibbling, pearling, polishing, rendering, roasting, or steaming. (This list is not all-inclusive.)

"**Labeler**" means a person who labels commercial feed. "Labeler" includes a person, other than the final retail purchaser, who retains the proprietary rights to the specifications of a commercial feed.

"**Commercial feed**" means all products or materials used or distributed for use as a feed or ingredient in the mixing or manufacturing of feed for animals or birds, **except** the following:

1. Non-processed, whole seeds or grains with an established USDA Grain Standard, and the unmixed meals made from them.
(Examples: whole corn, ground corn, oats, milo, millet); *cotton seed is not exempted;
2. Whole hays, straws, cottonseed hulls, stover (dried foliage & stalks), and silage (fermented, chopped plants) when unmixed with other materials;
3. Meat and other portions of animal or fish carcasses in their raw state without further processing, except freezing or denaturing.

B. WHO MUST HAVE A COMMERCIAL FEED LICENSE?

A license is required for:

- Any person who manufactures, labels or distributes commercial feed in/into Wisconsin.
- Manufacturers or distributors located outside of Wisconsin (no established place of business in Wisconsin) who distribute commercial feed into Wisconsin--one license fee will cover all such out-of-state sites.
- If you have out-of-state sites and just one in-state site, one license fee will cover all of your sites.
- If you have out-of-state sites and multiple sites in Wisconsin, one license fee will cover all such out-of-state sites **AND** an additional license fee is required for each Wisconsin site with manufacturing/labeling activity.

No license is required for persons distributing only:

- Packaged commercial feed in the original packages of a Wisconsin licensee, with that licensee's original label;
- Bulk commercial feed in the form received from a Wisconsin licensee, and as labeled by that licensee;
- Feeds custom-mixed at the request of the final purchaser at retail, using commercial feeds obtained from Wisconsin-licensed suppliers.

Feed licenses are annual (March 1 through February 28/29).

C. INSPECTION FEES AND TONNAGE REPORTS

An annual inspection fee must be paid on all commercial feed distributed in/into Wisconsin by persons required to be licensed. The inspection fee is on a per-ton basis, and the tonnage report for the previous calendar year is filed with the commercial feed license renewal application. As of January 1, 2002, tonnage fees are \$0.25 per ton of commercial feed. Sales of 1 pound to 2000 pounds are reported as one ton. Tonnage is reported in whole tons. Tonnage is rounded up to the next whole ton.

In the chain of distribution for a commercial feed, the one who first sells the feed in Wisconsin, or who first distributes the feed for further sale in Wisconsin is responsible for paying the inspection fee, unless the commercial feed is sold to an Exempt Buyer (see below). If a feed under your label is being shipped to a Wisconsin location from your out-of-state plant (regardless of billing address), you must pay the Wisconsin inspection fee. This is true even though the Wisconsin purchaser may take title and possession of the feed at your out-of-state plant. As the labeler, you would be the first person in the chain of distribution.

Exempt Buyers

Some feed manufacturers located in Wisconsin are classified by the Department as **Exempt Buyers** (see list). The Exempt Buyer is responsible for paying the inspection fee on all commercial feed it distributes; credit can be claimed by an Exempt Buyer for its sales outside Wisconsin or to other Exempt Buyers. Persons selling commercial feeds to Exempt Buyers may claim an inspection fee credit for that feed. Note that the tonnage of commercial feed sold to an Exempt Buyer should be included on your tonnage report (on page 3--column 1 or column 3). Then, claim the credit on page 3 (column 2 or 4) and itemize that credit on the lower half of page 4. Credits for sales to Exempt Buyers can only be taken from those Exempt Buyers approved by the Department.

D. COMMERCIAL FEED CATEGORIES

Feed tonnage should be reported in the proper category (on page 3 of the Commercial Feed Tonnage Annual Report) according to species (when indicated) and type of feed. Accurate reporting of your tonnage in the proper category will assist in making this information meaningful to the industry. **Ingredients not fitting into a listed category should be entered in "Miscellaneous Products"**. Use the following guidelines for determining the proper categories to report tonnage:

Complete Feeds are feeds designed to be fed as the sole ration to the animal, with no additional grain, forage or protein supplementation.

Supplements (also called **concentrates**) are feeds designed to be the major source of protein, minerals, trace minerals and vitamins to the animal. They would be fed or mixed with additional grain and/or forage. Beef or dairy supplements may contain grain and be fed with only additional forage.

Mineral Feeds may contain calcium, phosphorus, other macro-minerals and trace minerals; they usually do not contain protein or fat.

Vitamin Feeds may contain a variety of vitamins and are designed to provide vitamin supplementation to the feed.

Premixes may contain a mixture of vitamins, trace minerals or other micro-ingredients.

Veal/Calf Feeds are dry feeds (**not milk replacers**) fed to dairy, beef or veal calves.

Milk Replacers include milk replacers intended for any type of young animal (veal calves, beef calves, dairy calves, lambs, swine, or others).

Pet Foods are any products fed to animals kept as pets. *Wild bird food goes under Miscellaneous.*

Miscellaneous includes any commercial feeds not included in the other categories, such as wild bird food, mink feeds, direct fed microbial products, etc.

Medicated Feeds (see license form): There are two categories of animal drugs used in feed.

- **"FDA MFL Required"** also known as "Category II, Type A" drugs. Use of this type of drug requires a Federal Medicated Feed License (MFL) from Food & Drug Administration (FDA).
- **"Non-MFL"**: also known as "Category I" (but includes "Category II, Type B & C" drugs).

LICENSE REQUIREMENTS:

No person shall manufacture or distribute commercial feed in this state without an annual license from the department. "Manufacture" means to mix, blend, process, package or label commercial feed. No license shall be required of persons distributing only:

1. Packaged commercial feed in the original container of a licensed manufacturer or distributor, as packaged and labeled by them, and their name and address appear on the label.
2. Bulk commercial feed as received from, and properly labeled by, a licensee.
3. Feeds custom-mixed at retail if commercial feeds used in the mixture are obtained from a licensee, with an invoice verifying the licensee's payment of the inspection fee.

NOTE: Licenses are non-transferable and fees are non-refundable. Additional business locations may not begin operating during the license year without submitting an additional license application and payment of an additional \$25 fee.

Enter any mixed feed someone else manufactured for you with your label. Include any mixed feed which you took title to, prior to distributing it into Wisconsin. Also include mixed feed sold to Exempt Buyers (see enclosed list). (1 pound to 2,000 pounds = 1 ton)
4. COLUMN 3 (page 3): Enter all feed **ingredients** (bag or bulk) sold or distributed in Wisconsin under your name or label. Do not repeat those ingredients which were blended into your mixed feeds (they belong in Column 1). Include any ingredients sold to Exempt Buyers (see enclosed list).

NOTE: Unmixed whole seeds or grains, as defined by U.S. grain standards, should not be reported (see General Information sheet).

5. On page 3, add the totals of Columns 1 and 3. Enter this sum on page 1—line 1 (total tons distributed).

CLAIMING CREDIT:

1. COLUMN 2 (page 3): Complete this if another *licensed* company manufactured a mixed feed for you, put your label on the feed, and paid the tonnage fees. **Be sure to enter the supplier's license number, name, address and credit tons on page 4** ("CREDIT ITEMIZATION: Purchases of Prepaid . . .").

Also include mixed-feed tons sold to Exempt Buyers (see enclosed list); itemize those sales in the Exempt Buyer section on page 4 (license number, name, address, etc.).

2. COLUMN 4 (page 3): Complete this if another *licensed* company put *their* label on ingredients, premixes or concentrates and paid the tonnage fees; then you used these materials to make mixed feed with your label. To avoid duplicate reporting, enter your mixed-feed tons in Column 1 and claim the credit for the prepaid ingredient tons in Column 4.

If you are rebagging or relabeling another licensee's ingredients, and they have paid the tonnage fees, report the tons in Column 3 and use Column 4 to claim credit on these prepaid ingredients.

Be sure to enter the supplier's license number, name, address and tons claimed on page 4 ("CREDIT ITEMIZATION: Purchases of Prepaid . . .").

Also include ingredient tons sold to Exempt Buyers (see enclosed list) and itemize those credits on the lower half of page 4.

3. **IMPORTANT:** Sales to Exempt Buyers should be included on page 3 (column 1 or 3), to show the appropriate product category. Since these Buyers then have the responsibility to pay the tonnage on purchases from you, claim a credit on page 3 (column 2 or 4) and itemize that credit on lower half of page 4.
4. Add the totals of Columns 2 and 4 on page 3. Enter this sum on page 1—line 2 (tonnage credit).
5. **All credits must be itemized on page 4** (select "Prepaid" or "Exempt Buyer"). License numbers must be entered; ask your prepaid supplier, or call (608) 224-4537 to purchase a list of Feed licensees.

COMPLETE PAGE 1:

1. If your net tonnage is zero, no inspection fee is owed. There is no minimum tonnage fee.
2. To avoid any penalties, sign the form and mail it with your license renewal and all required fees *before* the last day of February.
3. **Errors or omissions will delay the issuance of your commercial feed license.**
