## Tank System Tightness Tester Certification Information

The following requirements must be met in order to conduct a tank system tightness testing specified in <u>ATCP 93</u>:

- Tank System Tightness Testers must hold a certification issued by DATCP.
- Tank System Tightness Testers and their employers must have no personal or monetary interest in the facility.

In addition to the required technician certification, companies performing or offering to perform this work must hold a Tank Specialty Firm Registration issued by DATCP. For additional information, please see our <u>Tank Specialty Firm fact sheet.</u>

A person who conducts tightness tests for tank systems as a certified tank system tightness tester must do all of the following:

- Conduct tightness tests in accordance with the material approval under <u>ATCP 93</u> and any additional manufacturer's instructions.
- Employ only those test methodologies for which training has been obtained.

To initially obtain a Tank System Tightness Tester Certification, you must submit:

- The Tank System Tightness Tester application, found here: <u>https://datcp.wi.gov/Documents/TR-WM-115.pdf</u>
- \$20 application fee (not applicable to electronic applications or renewals)
- \$50 certification fee
- Social Security Number Request form, found here: <u>https://datcp.wi.gov/Documents/SSNForm.pdf</u>
- The certificate of training provided by the entity with approval under <u>ATCP 93</u> for the methodology. You must have completed training in one or more tightness test methods approved under <u>ATCP 93</u> within the 2 years immediately preceding the application.

If you are a veteran, you may be eligible for a DVA voucher to cover the initial application and certification fees. Please contact the DVA at 1-800-WisVets or online at <u>www.WisVets.com</u> for more information.

Your Tank System Tightness Tester certification is valid for 2 years from the date of issue. To renew your certification, you must submit the Tank System Tightness Tester application and the \$50 fee prior to the expiration of your certification. Late applications are not accepted. If you do not submit your renewal prior to the expiration date, you must apply for a new certification.
