1.2 KEY POINTS RELATED TO SWRM GRANTS

- Email reimbursement requests to datcpswrm@wisconsin.gov

- Refer to Section 2-Policies and Procedures of the SWRM Grant Resources Webpage, for 2.2 [Cost-Share Funding Source Table and NR 151 Coding](#) to identify the correct unit of measurement for each ATCP 50 practice. The correct units must be included in the reimbursement request on the contract when submitting the reimbursement request. This reference document will also aid in identifying the correct NR151 code and associated cost-share rates.

- Other allowable uses for SEG cost-share funds:
 - As of the 2025 Joint Allocation Plan, counties can allocate 100% of their SEG award to support cropping practices, including nutrient management, contour farming, cover crops, residue management or stripcropping. Pre-approval is not required. A nutrient management plan checklist is required for reimbursement.

 - With preapproval from DATCP a county may use up to 50% of their SEG cost-share allocation if the project is in support of NM plan implementation on the following practices:
 - 50.62, Manure storage systems
 - 50.63, Manure storage closure
 - 50.70, Diversions
 - 50.71, Field windbreaks
 - 50.72, Filter strips
 - 50.80(3), Prescribed grazing (Fencing)
 - 50.80(4), Prescribed grazing (Establish permanent pasture seeding)
 - 50.83, Riparian buffers

A nutrient management plan checklist must be submitted with the reimbursement request.

- In 2024 the funding source for SWRM cost-share traditionally referred to as “bond” funds will be coming from general purpose revenue (GPR) funds. Bond or GPR funded cost-share projects will be referred to as “structural” practices.
