On behalf of TruGreen, we appreciate the Department's review of this rule and the opportunity to participate. We do have some general questions and figured we would send these via email to make it easier for a response from the Department.

We understand the proposed rule may:

— Update pesticide categories/category descriptions for commercial and private applicators

How will the categories change and what will the consequences be?

— Update minimum age requirements to get certified for commercial and private applicators

The minimum is 18 years of age under the federal standards so we anticipate that will be the minimum age under this rule?

— Update pesticide core standards descriptions for commercial and private applicators

What core standards is the Department looking at and will it require a change in the test? (which we do believe is already difficult)
