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DAIRY SERVICES SECTION RESPONSE

- Established Safety Measures
 - Management team established personal protective equipment (PPE) procedures.
 - Procured state-issued PPE and distributed to staff.
 - Following CDC guidance for essential personnel.



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ESTABLISHED SAFETY MEASURES CONTINUED

- Measures are being taken by staff:
 - Staff conduct daily self-assessments for symptoms.
 - PPE shall be worn on all inspections; social distancing practiced when possible.
 - Minimize number of people at a plant.
 - Staff visit only 1 plant per day.
 - Virtual record and food safety plan reviews when possible.
 - Developed a Dairy Services Section - Badger Bounce Back Plan.
 - Staff are calling ahead.
 - Very limited overnight travel



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GOVERNOR'S FACE COVERING MANDATE

- Communicate with dairy staff
- Minimize inspection group size
- Wear PPE and social distance
- We need industries assistance - partnership

Gov. Tony Evers has declared a public health emergency and issued an executive order requiring face coverings in all non-residential buildings.



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HOTSPOT RESPONSES

- Response may vary due to:
- Overall cases in a county
 - Infection rate, population density in a county
 - Rapid spikes observed in a county
 - Infected employees within a plant (rate, numbers, trend)
 - Different facility types
 - Goal is to complete work – no regulatory impact to milk flow
