

**CURRENT COVID MEASURES**

- Measures are being taken by staff:
  - Staff conduct daily self-assessments for symptoms.

  - Virtual record and food safety plan reviews when possible.
  - Overnight travel is occurring as needed.

**HAULING ISSUES IDENTIFIED AT FIRST MEETING.**

- Obtaining a stick reading on an overfilled sight glass tank from a single farm tank
- Rules don't address silos on farms
- Sanitizing & inspecting tanks
  - harsh chemicals de-nickleize
  - large tanks hard to inspect
- Avoiding last minute changes on capital projects
- How to determine proper agitation of a direct ship load


