This Toolkit translates Secure Food Supply (SFS) biosecurity guidance into clear, actionable practices for daily operations. By doing so, it helps reduce risk while supporting animal health, economic stability, and national security.



The Biosecurity Manager's toolkit was designed to aid in training on proper biosecurity measures and to promote the health of both livestock and people working with animals. It provides 5 different types of resources to help biosecurity managers effectively communicate biosecurity principles with all staff.

These resources include:

- Easy-reference guides to key SFS biosecurity concepts
- Short training videos filmed on farms using real-world demonstrations
- Interactive worksheet and answer keys for active learning
- Customizable memo and email templates for employee communication
- A training checklist to ensure comprehensive review
