LICENSING INFORMATION FOR VENDORS AT COMMUNITY EVENTS

Farmers' markets and other community events are popular places for food entrepreneurs to sell food items in Wisconsin. In most cases, a license is required by law to make and sell food in Wisconsin. If you are interested in making and selling food at a farmer's market or other community event, you may need a license at the location where the product is made, at the event, or both.

You may need a license for selling food products at the event if any of the following apply:

- You will be doing any food processing, such as cutting, mixing, cooking, or packaging.
- Your product needs to be cold held (41°F or less) for food safety.
- Your product needs to be hot held (135°F or higher) for food safety.

You may need a license for making food products off site if any of the following apply:

- You will be doing any food processing from a location other than the event, such as cutting, mixing, cooking, canning, freezing, drying, or packaging, unless there is an exemption.
- You are also selling items that require temperature control for food safety from that location.

Reminder:

Even if you are not required to obtain a license for your product, you are still responsible for providing a safe food product to consumers and following safe food handling practices and procedures.
