TANKER EMERGENCY TRANSFERS

- Anytime a tanker is transferred outside of a permitted facility
- Who to notify
 - DATCP emergency response:
 - (608) 224-4714
 - datcpfoodcomplaintemergencyresponse@wi.gov
 - DNR spill response hotline at (800) 943-0003
 - If milk is spilling from the bulk tank to the ground
 - Receiving dairy plant's quality assurance manager and confirm if the product can be received




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TANKER EMERGENCY TRANSFERS

Documentation

- Copies of load manifests and the bill of lading being delivered to destination
- Copies of any weight tickets
- Any photos of the accident and product transfer

Submit this information to the receiving plant's quality assurance manager and DATCP's emergency response program.



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ATCP 82

- Final step: has been submitted to the Legislature
- Potentially end of year completion

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Reporting Animal Diseases

How to Report Diseases

If you are reporting one of the following diseases:

- African Swine Fever (ASF)
- Classical Swine Fever (CSF)
- Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) in any species
- New and Old World Screwworm (ONWS)
- Rabies
- Sheep and Goat Pox
- Vesicular conditions of any type (i.e. Foot and Mouth Disease)
- Vesicular Nerveless Disease

Immediately contact a DATCP district veterinarian.

1) If no answer, leave a message and a cell back number.
2) If you don't receive a call back within two hours, call your district veterinarian again.
3) If there is no answer, call any other district veterinarian until you have succeeded in contacting someone.
4) If you receive no response after following the above protocol, contact the Wisconsin Duty Officer 1-800-940-0003 and select option 42. State that you are reporting a potential animal disease.

Cattle Diseases

- Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI/HPN) in Dairy Cattle

HPAI/H5N1 Detection and Next Steps

- **Initial Testing:** If H5N1 is detected, DATCP's Division of Animal Health will be notified by the WVDL and the Division of Animal Health will notify the farm.
- **Follow-Up:** DATCP's Division of Animal Health will work with affected farms regarding quarantine requirements. For more information, refer to the [What To Do if H5N1 is Confirmed on Your Dairy Farm](#) resource document on DATCP's website.
- **Milk Standards:** Farms may continue shipping milk if it meets "normal" milk standards under [ATCP 65.20](#) (milk that is not bloody, stringy, off-colored, or otherwise abnormal). Additionally, the [Food and Drug Administration](#) and USDA continue to emphasize that the commercial milk supply is safe because of the pasteurization process.
- **Any H5N1 detections** will also be confirmed by the National Veterinary Services Laboratories (NVSL).

PLAN REVIEW REQUIREMENTS

- 65.14(6) REVIEW OF PLANS. (a) Before installing, reconstructing, or extensively altering a bulk tank, milking system, milk handling system, milkhous, milking parlor, or dairy farm water supply system, the **installer** shall, on behalf of the milk producer, submit plans to the division for review.
 - DATCP returns comments within 14 days, \$25 fee
- 65.14(7) Signed written statement certifying compliance

MILK PRODUCER LICENSING

- 65.02(2)(b) 15 days to act on a complete application
- Please submit new milk producer application via MyDATCP 1-2 weeks prior to anticipated licensing date.
- Option for a temporary B license only for up to 40 days.



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CREAM COOLING

65.54(2)(f) (f) Cream, skim milk, or low-fat milk that have been treated with heat to an extent less than pasteurization, and then shipped in bulk to another dairy plant for use in manufacturing dairy products. Cream, skim milk, and low-fat milk, after being heated to an extent less than pasteurization, shall **immediately** be cooled to a temperature of 45° F. or less.

Issues noted with older processes not maintaining cream temperatures.

- 1,002 in the last 12 months



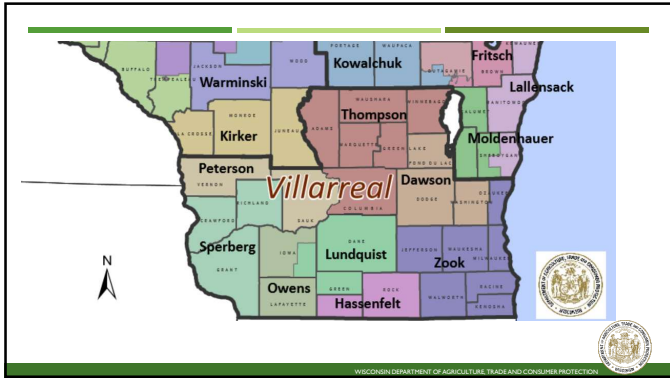
