REGISTERED FARM-RAISED DEER HERD RULE REMINDERS FOR DOUBLE PROTECTIVE BARRIERS

1. The herd must be enrolled in the CWD Herd Status Program to move live animals.
2. Any non-enrolled white-tailed deer herd must meet DNR fencing regulations under NR 16.45.
3. A double protective barrier means one or a combination of either of the following systems, which fully encloses a farm-raised deer herd and is approved by the department:
 - A double fence that is at least 8 feet high at every point. The 2 fences must be at least 8 feet but not more than 16 feet apart at every point.
 - A solid barrier that is at least 8 feet high at every point.
4. The department may by written notice, without prior notice or hearing, suspend a herd's enrollment in the CWD herd status program if at least 2 wild deer found or killed within 5 miles of the farm-raised deer herd have tested positive for CWD, and the farm-raised deer herd is not enclosed by a double protective barrier.
5. Except as specified under s. ATCP 10.56(1), a certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) must accompany any farm-raised deer that is moved from a herd in this state. If the farm-raised deer herd is located within 5 miles of where 2 or more wild deer have been found or killed and have tested positive for CWD, the CVI must indicate that the deer was adequately separated by a double protective barrier from the wild deer herd known to be infected with CWD. The double protective barrier must have been installed before, or within a reasonable time after, the farm-raised deer keeper was first notified of the disease finding in the second wild deer.

II. OTHER

1. Draw a diagram of the double protective barrier area. If double fenced, indicate the placement of the secondary fence in relationship to the primary fence. Include all gates, gate height, and distance between the double fences.
2. Record GPS coordinates of the front gate, any other gates, and the outer-most corners of the double protective barrier area on the diagram under 1 above.
3. Take a digital picture of each alleyway, and gates to document alleyway distances, gate placements (show whether completely down to the ground), and fence heights.
