Export Highlights — Year-To-Date (Quarter 1) 2024

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Highlights


Wisconsin food, forestry, and agriculture product exports reached \$990 million in the first quarter of 2024, third highest on record. The first quarter of 2024 is \$78 million, nearly 9%, above 2021, the Wisconsin Initiative for Agricultural Exports (WIAE) base year.

Demand remains steady from 2023; however, the continued strong dollar is slowing exports to Korea and Japan, and trade tensions with China are reflected in agricultural exports to that major market. In addition, conflicts in the Ukraine and Israel and slow economic growth in several countries are continued headwinds. The May 2024 USDA Outlook for U.S. Agricultural Trade is forecast to be 4.6% below 2023.


U.S. Q1 agricultural exports are \$52.5 billion, nearly 3% below 2023. Wisconsin is 11th in the U.S. for agricultural exports, up from 13th in 2021.

Top Markets: Wisconsin's top five agricultural export markets are Canada, Mexico, China, Japan and Korea, representing 66% of total exports. Mexico is up over 3%. Germany (No. 6) is up nearly 27% and Australia (No. 7) is up 36%. **Wisconsin exported to 131 countries in the first quarter of 2024.**

Top Products: Wisconsin's top five agricultural product exports make up 46% of all exports. Dairy is up nearly 27%, prepared vegetables are up over 6% and wood products are up over 11%. The top 10 products make up 69% of total exports. Meat preparations (brats) are up nearly 16% and flavorings and aromatics from plants are up nearly 9%. Four of the top five products are above 2021 and the Q1 total of all other products is \$536 million, which is \$18 million above 2021.












Product Group Highlights


The 2023 exports of \$3.87 billion in agricultural products are tracked in three product groups:


- Dairy: cheese, whey, lactose, and milk proteins 13% of all Wisconsin agricultural exports
- Meat: livestock, bovine genetics, hides, and furs 20% of all Wisconsin agricultural exports
- Crop: grains, forestry, processed foods, and beverages 67% of all Wisconsin agricultural exports














Wisconsin is number one in the U.S. for the export of ginseng, cranberries, specialty cheeses, prepared meats, bovine genetics, and mink pelts.
