Dear Wisconsin Children's Safety Advocates:

In February 2022, the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission issued **fourteen** recalls relating to products affecting children. Attached is a summary of the releases identifying the product, the problem, and what should be done with the recalled product.

We have found that not all of the recalls are picked up by the news media as they occur. This monthly summary will give you the opportunity to review all of the children's product safety recalls for the past month. Release Number: (#22-066) Amazon, of Seattle, Wash., is announcing the voluntary recall of about 3,800 children's robes. This recall involves BAOPTAIL-branded children's 100% micro polyester (fleece) robes. They were sold in various colors, patterns, and in sizes 2T through 14 Years. The long-sleeved, hooded robes have two front pockets and a sewn-in, side-seam matching belt. "Made in China," the size, the fiber content and the washing instructions are printed on a sewn-in, side-seam label.

Problem: The children's robes fail to meet the federal flammability standards for children's sleepwear, posing a risk of burn injuries to children.

What to do: Consumers should immediately take the recalled robes away from children and stop using them. Consumers who purchased the robes from Amazon will be contacted through Amazon's messaging platform and provided prepaid mailers to return the robes for a full refund. This recall involves KOYO Bounca the Squig Limited Edition Plush toys. The orange plush toy monster has gray antlers, two legs, no arms, a wide-open mouth with big teeth, and green and red pom-poms. The words "KOYO" and "Manufactured by GA Global Limited T/A The Koyo Store" are printed on a fabric sewn in label on the bottom of the toy.

Problem: The pom-poms can detach from the toy, posing a choking hazard to young children.

What to do: Consumers should immediately take the recalled plush toy away from young children and return the toy to any Games Workshop or Warhammer store for a full refund, or destroy the product by cutting off the tail with scissors and provide photographic proof of destruction by emailing the photo to custserv@gwplc.com or uploading photo using the form at <https://www.games-workshop.com/recall> for a full refund. 

Release Number: (#22-069) D & D Technologies (USA) Inc., of Huntington Beach, Calif., is announcing the voluntary recall of about 1,500 SureClose® READYFIT 180° Hinge-Closer Sets. This recall involves OL.MI-branded SureClose READYFIT 180 hinge-closer sets with model numbers 74108333T and 74108335T. The hydraulic hardware is intended for mounting on gates. They were sold with mounting screws and in sets of two hinge-closers per kit with dimples on the end. The recalled hinge-closer sets were manufactured between October 2018 and September 2019. OL.MI, and the date code in MM/YY format are on the end of the body of the hinge-closer and visible when the hinge-closer is in the open position.

Problem: The hinge-closers can malfunction and not fully self-close gates when installed. This can lead to unintended access to pools and other areas, posing injury and drowning hazards to young children.

What to do: Consumers should immediately stop using the hinge-closers and secure access to areas where gates with the hinge-closers are used until the recalled hinge-closers have been replaced. Contact D&D Technologies to receive either a full refund or to schedule hinge-closer replacement at no cost. Consumers will also receive instructions on how to return recalled hinges to D&D Technologies via mail free of charge. The nightgowns were available in three styles: long-sleeved, short-sleeved and long-sleeved with a matching doll nightgown. The nightgowns are made of 100% cotton and were sold in children's sizes 3T through 9. The nightgowns were manufactured in pink stripes with three ribbons at the neck; pink with flower print and pink with unicorn print; pink with lace décor; green, red and yellow striped nightgowns with a cherry embroidered on the left chest and blue and pink with a cherries print. The sewn-in label has Chinese lettering.

Problem: The children's nightgowns fail to meet federal flammability standards for children's sleepwear, posing a risk of burn injuries to children.

What to do: Consumers should immediately take the recalled nightgowns away from children and stop using them. This recall involves the Stance Kids Reiny Szn Mid-Cushion Crew Sock with UPC M: 19107481113 and UPC L: 190107481120. The UPC codes can be found on the back of the hangtag on the sock. The socks were sold in children's sizes medium and large. These combed cotton blend socks are brown with a black heel and toe, have a reindeer image on the socks with gold jingling bells attached around the ankle of the socks.

Problem: The bells attached to the socks can detach, posing aspiration and choking hazards to young children.

This recall involves Adam the Apple children's stackable toys. The toys have 15 wooden pieces with a story written on each piece. They measure about 6 inches tall and 6.5 inches wide when stacked and look like a happy-faced red apple with a leaf atop. The phrases Adam the Apple, By Chris Bayon and Illustrated by Patrick Carlson are written on the leaf.

Problem: Surface paint on the wooden toys contains levels of lead that exceed the federal lead paint ban. Lead is toxic if ingested by young children and can cause adverse health effects.

What to do: Consumers should immediately take the recalled toys away from children and contact Stack Em' Up Books to receive a pre-paid shipping label to return the recalled product, regardless of whether they purchased the product or received it as a free giveaway. The children's sleepwear was sold in sizes 12 months to 14 years. Children's sleepwear with the style number beginning with SF9 and a cut number of 1812, 2730, 7082 or 7104 printed on a label behind the garment's size and care labeling are included in the recall.

Problem: The recalled children's sleepwear garments fail to meet the flammability standards for children's sleepwear, posing a risk of burn injuries to children.

Problem: The children's sleepwear sets fail to meet the federal flammability standards for children's sleepwear, posing a risk of burn injuries to children.

Release Number: (#22-724) Zeno Inc., of Weymouth, Mass., is announcing the voluntary recall of about 1,355 infant walkers. This recall involves Zeno collapsible infant walkers with adjustable height settings. The walkers have a black, teal, pink or gray frame; a gray or black seat and a white, teal or pink tray. Some styles have toy attachments and a push handle and "Babywalker" stitched on the seat back.

Problem: The infant walkers fail to meet the federal safety standard. They can fit through a standard doorway and are not designed to stop at the edge of a step as required by the federal safety standard. The walkers also have leg openings that allow the child to slip down until the child's head can become entrapped at the neck. Babies using these walkers can be seriously injured or killed.

What to do: Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled infant walkers and contact Zeno via e-mail to receive a shipping label to return the infant walker free of charge. Upon receipt of the infant walker, consumers will be issued a full refund of the purchase price. Zeno is notifying all known purchasers directly. Only cups with a handle are included in this recall.

Problem: The handle can detach from the steel cup, posing a choking hazard to young children.

This recall involves 12 different styles of wooden teethers, including shapes of butterflies, boats, flowers and dinosaurs. The teethers measure 3” x 3” x 1” and are stamped with “Bebe au Lait” and one of the following date codes: 02-2019, 10-2020, or 03-2021.

Problem: The string that connects the beads on the teethers can come untied, releasing the beads and posing a choking hazard to young children.

What to do: Consumers should immediately take the recalled teethers away from children and contact Bebe au Lait for instructions on how to receive a full refund or store credit. This recall involves the Mama & Me MINI children’s leather handbags. The recalled handbags measure about 6.5 inches high, 9.5 inches wide and 3.25 inches deep and were sold in three different colors or color combinations: coral, coral/purple and taupe. The handbags have a top zipper, an interior slip pocket and a detachable, 21 inch-long, gold and leather strap that can be shortened or removed. The Kelly Wynne logo is printed on a golden sewn-in label located on the inside of the handbag. The following SKU and UPC numbers combinations can be found on the order invoice: SKU MINI505 and UPC 850023783271; SKU MINI875 and UPC 850023783288; and SKU MINI500 and UPC 850023783288.

Problem: The metal zipper slider, zipper O-ring, d-ring, rivet and stud of the children’s handbags contain levels of lead that exceed the federal lead content ban. Lead is toxic if ingested by young children and can cause adverse health issues.

What to do: Consumers should immediately take the recalled handbags away from children and contact Kelly Wynne for a full refund if purchased at kellywynne.com or contact Nordstrom if purchased at Nordstrom.com. Kelly Wynne and Nordstrom are contacting all known purchasers directly, and will provide pre-paid shipping labels for consumers to return the recalled product for a full refund.
