

Things You Should Know Before You Start Selling Plants in Wisconsin

- Contact the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) Plant Industry Bureau to purchase your <u>Nursery Grower/Nursery Dealer/Christmas Tree Grower License</u>. This is an annual license required for anyone selling more than \$250 in perennial plants that can survive a Wisconsin winter outdoors.
- 2. If you plan to <u>ship your stock out of a quarantine</u>, state, or country, you may need a <u>Compliance</u> <u>Agreement</u>, Plant Health Certificate, or Phytosanitary Certificate from DATCP.
- 3. Do you need a pesticide applicator's license? See DATCP <u>Bureau of Agrichemical Management</u>.
- 4. Is the property zoned for business use/agricultural use? Can you sell/grow nursery stock on this piece of property? (check your county zoning ordinances)
- 5. Check with your local county zoning office as permits are needed for building, conditional use/special exemption, sanitary, or signage. If needed, is there wildlife damage help?
- 6. Check with your local Department of Natural Resources for <u>storm water permits</u>. Water regulations may apply next to running streams. A well contractor would need a well permit to drill a new well.
- 7. DNR regulates invasive species. Review the <u>list of invasive plants</u> that cannot be sold in Wisconsin. (<u>www.dnr.wi.gov/topic/invasives</u>)
- 8. Check with the <u>Department of Transportation</u> if any signage is within highway right-of-ways.
- 9. Contact the Wisconsin Department of Revenue to obtain a <u>Sales Tax Permit</u>.
- **10.** Check with the <u>Wisconsin Department of Financial Institutions</u> to see if your business name is available or has already been chosen.
- **11.** Do you sell seed from open bulk containers or sell seed that you have produced or packaged? You may need a <u>Seed Labelers License</u> from DATCP.
- 12. Contact your local resources with questions you may have. <u>UW-Extension</u>, UW researchers in Entomology, Pathology and Horticulture Studies, Professional Industry Grower Associations; <u>Wisconsin Nursery and Landscape Association</u>, <u>Commercial Flower Growers of Wisconsin</u>, Wisconsin Landscape Federation, <u>Wisconsin Christmas Tree Producers Association</u>, <u>Minnesota Nursery and Landscape Association</u> and <u>American Nursery and Landscape</u> <u>Association/AmericanHort</u> are all valuable resources.
