
- Five different DATCP grants included
 - Staffing
 - Cost-share
 - NMFE
 - Innovation
 - Cooperator

- Funding to all 72 counties
- Goals:
 - 100% of 1st position
 - 70% of 2nd position
 - 50% of 3rd position and subsequent positions

Total Proposed Award: \$11,214,400


STAFFING GRANTS

- Structural cost-share
 - 72 awarded
- All applicants received an award.

Total Proposed Award: \$3,500,000



COST-SHARE GRANTS


STRUCTURAL COST-SHARE (FORMERLY BOND COST-SHARE)

- 61 awarded
- All applicants received an award.

Total Proposed Award: \$2, 183,000


COST-SHARE GRANTS

- 23 applications and awards
- Tier I Funding: NM training to producers and plan writers to develop a 590-compliant NM plan
- Tier 2 Funding: Training, but no plan required
- Funding for laptops for training

NUTRIENT MANAGEMENT FARMER EDUCATION



- Staffing Grants \$11,214,400 (55% of requests)
- Cost-share Grants
 - Bond \$3,500,000 (54% of requests)
 - SEG \$2,183,000 (84% of requests)
 - Eng Reserve \$150,000
- Cooperator Grants
 - Statewide projects \$1,022,761 (89% of requests)
 - Innovation \$69,848 (25% of requests)
 - NMFE \$399,391 (100% of requests)



ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

The environmental effects of the proposed allocation plan are positive. Through support for conservation staff and landowner cost-sharing, the proposed allocation plan will result in actions on farms and other areas that reduce soil erosion, prevent farm runoff, improve soil health, increase nutrient management planning, and minimize pollution of surface and ground water.
