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**Call to Order**

The Land and Water Conservation Board (Board) met in person at 2811 Agriculture Drive, Madison WI 53718 and over Microsoft Teams on **June 2, 2026**. The meeting was preceded by public notice as required by Wis. Stat. § 19.84. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Mark Cupp at **9:00 am** and the pledge of allegiance was conducted.

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Brad Herrick, Lakeshore Nature Preserve Director, UW-Madison presented on the ecology and impacts of jumping worms.

**Item #6      Agency Reports**

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- a. FSA- Krauss provided a written report that is available online at the Land and Water Conservation Board website within the June 2, 2026 [meeting packet](#).
- b. NRCS- Gerlich reported NRCS national leadership change, new leader is Chief Colton Buckley. Local workgroup is scheduled for June 23. Notice of funding opportunity for Conservation Innovation grants – Classic and On-farm Trials. \$65 million available between two programs. National F&W Foundation RFP out for 2026 grants to support conservation.

- c. UW-CALS- No updated provided.
- d. UW-Extension – No update provided.
- e. WI Land + Water- Osterman reported that WI L&W moved into new building on South Blount Street. Friday June 5 first of five training opportunities for state-wide trainings focused on relationships between LCC and LCD staff.
- f. DOA- Potts starting next budget cycle, beginning with JFC finalizing base budget. Working with Governor's office to get information out to Departments regarding budget instructions. Knowles-Nelson Stewardship program ends at the end of June 2026, so working with DNR to capitalize any available funds.
- g. DATCP- Clayton reports on Conservation Agronomy trainings starting this summer, targeting new county employees. 51 people signed up for field sessions this summer. 2026 NM regional meetings begin in August (5 meetings across the state). Application out for \$300,000 in engineering reserve funds to address runoff needs.
- h. DNR- DNR- Knutson referred to written update attached to meeting notes. A stakeholder meeting was held as part of the Nutrient loss reduction strategy with over 200 stakeholders in attendance. SOC to create two new standards for use of alum in stormwater ponds. Collaborative targeted watershed assessment of Four-Mile Creek includes Wood and Portage counties; Nepco Lake District, Petenwell and Castle Rock Stewards, farmers, Domtar paper mill, and UWSP. PRA project – measure the rate of compliance with each ag performance standard across the state and to determine if areas out of compliance are due cost-share. Grants application period closed April 15. Fewer TRM grant applications for 2027. Working with WI L&W to make the TRM grants more accessible. New staff for regional nonpoint coordinator: Rob Wheeler SE region. Three new CAFO staff: Jeremy Kleinsmith (LaCrosse), Phil Gruber (Wausau), Ben Mrdutt (Eau Claire).
