

Kenosha County Fast Facts:

- Population = 169,151 (8th in WI)
- Towns = 5 (Brighton, Paris, Randall, Somers, Wheatland)
- Villages = 7 (Bristol, Genoa City, Paddock Lake, Pleasant Prairie, Salem Lakes, Somers, Twin Lakes)
- City = 1 (Kenosha – County Seat, 4th largest in WI)
- Approximately 272 sq. miles of land area (4th smallest in WI)
- Since 2000, population growth has been in excess of 12%




Kenosha County Agriculture

- Contributes nearly \$352 million in economic activity annually
- Employs over 3,500 people
- Includes dairy farms, large scale grain operations, small fruit and vegetable farms, nursery and greenhouse production, and equine facilities (#4 in state)






Pike River South Branch Project
