

Regulated Invasive Plants Found in the Nursery Trade

Trees and Shrubs



Amur Cork Tree
(*Phellodendron amurense*)
Other names: Chinese cork tree, Sakhalin cork tree
Exemptions: male cultivars and seedling understock



Amur maple
(*Acer tataricum* subsp. *ginnala*)
Other names: Siberian maple, ginnala maple
Exemptions: all cultivars



Black alder
(*Alnus glutinosa*)
Other names: European alder
Exemptions: all cultivars and hybrids



Burning bush
(*Euonymus alatus*)
Other names: winged euonymus, burning tree, winged wahoo
Exemptions: All cultivars except the straight species and 'Nordine'



Glossy buckthorn
(*Rhamnus frangula*)
Other names: *Frangula alnus*, alder buckthorn, columnar buckthorn
Exemptions: cultivars *Asplenifolia* and *Fineline*



Japanese barberry
(*Berberis thunbergii*)
Other names: barberry, Thunberg's barberry, Japanese berberis
Exemptions: All cultivars, varieties and hybrids not listed in the rule are exempt. See NR40 for more details.



Wineberry
(*Rubus phoenicolasius*)
Other names: wine raspberry, Japanese wineberry
Exemptions: none



Chinese/Japanese wisteria
(*Wisteria sinensis/floribunda*)
Other names: wisteria, fuji, Nodafuji, *Rehsonia floribunda*, *Kraundia floribunda*, *Glycine floribunda*
Exemptions: none

Vines



Chocolate vine
(*Akebia quinata*)
Other names: fiveleaf akebia, fiveleaf, *Akebia micrantha*, *Rajania quinata*
Exemptions: none



Crown vetch
(*Coronilla varia*)
Other names: trailing crown vetch, purple crown vetch, *Securigera varia*
Exemptions: none



Japanese honeysuckle
(*Lonicera japonica*)
Other names: Hall's honeysuckle vine, Chinese honeysuckle, *Lonicera japonica* var. *halliana*
Exemptions: none



Porcelain berry
(*Ampelopsis brevipedunculata*)
Other names: amur peppervine, porcelain vine, variegated porcelain berry
Exemptions: none

Restricted species

Cannot be sold, transported, or introduced



Prohibited species

Cannot be possessed, sold, transported, or introduced

Aquatics



Parrot feather

(*Myriophyllum aquaticum*)

Other names: Brazilian watermilfoil, red-stemmed parrot feather

Exemptions: none



Water hyacinth

(*Eichhornia crassipes*)

Other names: water orchid, floating water hyacinth, *Pontederia crassipes*

Exemptions: none




Water lettuce

(*Pistia stratiotes*)

Other names: tropical duckweed, *Pistia spathulata*

Exemptions: none



Yellow floating heart

(*Nymphoides peltata*)

Other names: floating heart, entire marshwort, fringed waterlily

Exemptions: none

Grasses and Forbs



Bishop's goutweed

(*Aegopodium podagraria*)

Other names: snow-on-the-mountain, goutwort, Herb-Gerard, ground-elder, jackjump-about

Exemptions: None



Dame's rocket

(*Hesperis matronalis*)

Other names: dame's violet, mother-of-the-evening, sweet rocket

Exemptions: none



Lyme grass

(*Leymus arenarius*)

Other names: sand ryegrass, *Elymus arenarius*

Exemptions: none



Moneywort

(*Lysimachia nummularia*)

Other names: creeping Jenny, creeping Joan, running Jenny

Exemptions: cultivars Aurea and yellow/gold leaf forms



Ribbon grass

(*Phalaris arundinacea* var. *picta*)

Other names: gardener's garters

Exemptions: the parent type= reed canary grass



Tansy

(*Tanacetum vulgare*)

Other names: common tansy, golden buttons, garden tansy

Exemptions: cultivars Aureum and Crispum



Woodland forget-me-not

(*Myosotis sylvatica*)

Other names: forget-me-not, Victoria blue, *Myosotis sylvaticum*, *Myosotis oblongata*

Exemptions: None



Yellow iris

(*Iris pseudacorus*)

Other names: yellow flag iris, water flag, European yellow iris, pale yellow iris

Exemptions: None
