Private Applicators

When is certification needed for private applicators?

Private applicators that apply general use products to property that they own/control does NOT require certification. Certification **IS** required when a private applicator wants to use a Restricted Use Pesticide (RUP).

Steps to Certification:

- 1. Purchasing a training manual from the <u>UW PAT Store</u>.
- Self-study and schedule the exam at your local extension office or take it online through <u>Pearson Vue</u> <u>OR</u> attend a <u>training session</u> put on by the UW PAT Program.
- Once you pass the exam, you will receive your new or updated certification card in the mail seven to 10 business days after the exam.

Private Certification Categories:

- 100.0/101.0 General Farming
- 104.0/105.0 Greenhouse & Nursery
- 112.0/113.0 Fruit Crop
- 107.0 Soil Fumigation (Sub categories)
- 109.0 Chemigation (Sub categories)
- 111.0 Aerial (Sub categories)
 - In order to get certification in a sub category, you must get certification in one of the first three certifications listed.

Reminders:

- If you are making applications for other agricultural producers that exceed 500 acres, or for more than three other agricultural producers, you are considered a commercial applicator and will need to get certified and licensed.
- When making RUP applications, you must have records, and keep those records for two years.
 When making Atrazine applications, records must be kept for three years.
- Review labels for additional training that may need to be done prior to using (ex. Paraquat).

Address or Name Change?

• Notify the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) if an applicator address or name changes during the license year.
