


WISCONSIN AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS QUARTER THREE, YEAR-TO-DATE 2024

Top 10 products (68% of total exports):

up 3.97% from 2023

- I. Sauces, Yeasts up 4%
- 2. Dairy up 30% (cheese, curd, whey)
- 3. Vegetables, Fruits up 17%
- 4. Wood up 11% (rail ties)
- 5. Meat- sausages up 18%
- 6. Beverages down 36% (ethanol, non-alcohol beverages)
- 7. Oilseeds down 5%
- 8. Flavorings, Aromatics up 8%
- 9. Meat- cuts down 16%
- 10. Bovine semen down 10%




August 2024 USDA national export forecast down 2.6%

WISCONSIN AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS QUARTER THREE, YEAR-TO-DATE 2024 – COUNTRIES

Top 10 markets: 75% of total

- I. Canada down 5% (ethanol, cereals)
- 2. Mexico down 2% (soybeans, cereals)
- 3. China down 2% (bovine semen, sugars)
- 4. Korea down 13% (beef, sweet corn)
- 5. Japan up 3% (dairy, flavorings, aromatics)
- 6. Germany up 24% (flavorings, aromatics)
- 7. Australia up 5% (dairy, vegetables, fruit)
- 8. Netherlands flat
- 9. Italy up 147% (wheat, meslin, bovine semen)
- 10. United Kingdom down 5% (bovine semen)



Wisconsin is up 3.97%; US is down 0.81%



WISCONSIN AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS QUARTER THREE, YEAR-TO-DATE 2024 – DAIRY

Top 10 countries: 78% of total

- I. Canada up 33% (cheese, whey)
- 2. China up 2% (whey, milk albumins)
- 3. Mexico up 55% (cheese, curd, whey)
- 4. Korea up 37% (milk albumins, cheese, curd)
- 5. Japan up 56% (milk albumins, whey, cheese)
- 6. Australia up 36% (cheese, curd)
- 7. Brazil up 83% (milk albumins, lactose)
- 8. India up 27% (lactose syrup)
- 9. Bahrain up 358% (whey, cheese, curd)
- 10. Uruguay up 89% (lactose)

WISCONSIN AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS QUARTER THREE, YEAR-TO-DATE 2024 – MEAT

Top 10 countries: 80% of total

- I. Canada up 6% (peptones, purebred cattle)
- 2. Japan down 11% (fresh/chilled beef)
- 3. Korea down 36% (fresh/chilled beef)
- 4. China down 31% (bovine semen, cow leather up)
- 5. Finland up 0.3% (mink)
- 6. Taiwan up 156% (beef)
- 7. Mexico down 26% (cow leather, bovine offal up)
- 8. Germany up 26% (peptones)
- 9. UK down 23% (bovine semen)
- 10. Turkey up 259% (bovine semen, purebred cattle)

Kazakhstan up from \$674 thousand to \$6.3 million (bovine semen)

Meat Top 5 Export Countries Q3 YTD 2024 (\$ Millions)





WISCONSIN AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS QUARTER THREE, YEAR-TO-DATE 2024 – CROPS

Top 10 countries: 77% of total

- I. Canada down II% (ethanol, non-alcohol beverages)
- 2. Mexico down 7% (soybeans, wheat, meslin, corn up)
- 3. China up 21% (cranberries, ginseng)
- Germany up 20% (flavorings, aromatics, enzymes, sauces)
- 5. Italy up 133% (wheat, meslin)
- 6. Netherlands up 4% (cranberries, sauces)
- 7. Australia up 15% (cranberries, wood)
- 8. Japan up 1% (cranberries and juice)
- 9. Korea down 7% (sweet corn)
- 10. United Kingdom up 15% (animal feed, cranberries)



"All others" up 23%, driving overall increase of 2.0%


