The purpose of the WI LFPA program is to strengthen food and agricultural supply chain resiliency, support Wisconsin farmers, and distribute fresh nutritious foods to underserved communities.

- Support local producers and processors by building and expanding economic opportunities.
- **Broaden and strengthen partnerships** with local producers and processors with food distribution partners and local food networks to ensure distribution of fresh and nutritious foods in underserved communities.

The goal is for 80% of products to be sourced from socially disadvantaged and historically underserved producers as defined by the USDA.

The Wisconsin Food Hub Cooperative partners to manage logistics from farm-to-food access programs.

Purchase Assistance Program

The Wisconsin Local Food Purchase Assistance (WI LFPA) Program is made possible by the United States Department of Agriculture's LFPA Cooperative Agreement with Wisconsin. The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) partners with the Marbleseed, the Wisconsin Farmers Union (WFU), and the Wisconsin Food Hub Cooperative (WFHC) to create and implement the WI LFPA program.

TWO WI LFPA GRANTS will be available beginning October 12, 2023.

Farmers can participate in both WI LFPA grants.

DIRECT-TO-FARMERS GRANT PROGRAM: ADMINISTERED BY MARBLESEED

Grants ranging from \$5,000 to \$25,000 will be available for Wisconsin farm businesses. Contracts will include price agreements for pre-season projected products, pre-season payment schedules, product quality, as well as procurement and distribution procedures. Farmers selected to supply for the program benefit from WI LFPA educational programming will receive training and technical assistance, have access to community building and networking events, work with food system and hunger relief partners, and the opportunity to feed underserved communities. The ideal applicant has wholesale experience or is interested in expanding their business to reach farm-to-food access programs.

COMMUNITY PARTNERS GRANT PROGRAM: ADMINISTERED BY DATCP

Projects ranging from \$30,000 to \$300,000 will be awarded through a competitive grant process. This is a one-time funding opportunity designed to implement projects that purchase Wisconsin- grown, raised, or minimally processed food and distribute it at no cost to underserved communities.
