# WISCONSIN DAIRY TASK FORCE 2.0 SUB-COMMITTEE ON MARKETS MINUTES

#### Call to Order

Sub-Committee Chair Rob Byrne called the meeting to order at 10:02 a.m.

## **Minutes**

Members of the group introduced themselves.

Krista Knigge, Administrator for the Division of Agricultural Development at the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection, served as the resource person for the sub-committee.

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Ms. Knigge presented to the group. After reviewing the Division of Agricultural Development at DATCP, Ms. Knigge highlighted challenges and opportunities for the dairy industry in Wisconsin. These items are outlined below:

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After Ms. Knigge completed her presentation and for the rest of the morning session, the group worked to collapse the issues identified at the August meeting of the full Task Force. The list with some commentary that was generated is below.

- Classification and related pricing issues
- Component Issues
  - Ted Galloway suggested that we abrogate our markets to others because we don't
    make powder, which helps processors avoid higher costs on inputs. He also noted
    market tightness on cream in the U.S. southeast, which Beth Wells connected to
    the larger tight market surrounding cream.
- Exports
  - Freight access to ports for exports is difficult
  - o There are opportunities, need to identify growing markets
  - o Regional cooperation
- Transportation
  - o If transportation is the issue it is, why are we doing so much extra shipping?
- Oversupply
- Missed Marketing Opportunities
  - o "Red barn" message
  - o Premium and specialty markets
