CONSERVATION STANDARDS COMPLIANCE

- In accordance with s. 91.80, Wis. Stats. any landowner claiming the farmland preservation tax credit under s. 71.613, Wis. Stats. shall comply with applicable land and water conservation standards promulgated by the Department under ss. 92.05(3)(c) and (k), 92.14(8) and 281.16(3)(b) and (c).
 - Per ATCP 50.16, any landowner claiming the farmland preservation tax credit shall comply with the standards and practices of ATCP 50.04
 - ATCP 50.16 also includes clarifications related to certifications of compliance, monitoring, performance schedules, and notices of non-compliance.

ATCP 50.04

- (I) Non-point source pollution control- A landowner shall implement conservation practices that achieve compliance with DNR performance standards under ss. NR 151.02 to 151.08, in effect on May 1, 2014.
- (2) Soil Erosion Control- Prevent soil loss by ensuring activities on fields do not exceed tolerable soil loss ("T")
- (3) Nutrient Management Plan
- (4) Tillage Setback

ATCP 50.04- CROPLAND/PASTURE STANDARDS IN SHORT

- Develop and implement a NMP in accordance with the NRCS 590 standard
- Cropped fields and pastures meet "T"
- All croplands and pasture meet the Phosphorus Index (PI) standard
- No tillage within 5 feet of surface waters. Tillage setback may require anywhere between 5 and 20 feet depending on site evaluation.

ATCP 50.04- LIVESTOCK STANDARDS IN SHORT

- No unconfined manure piles in a Water Quality Management Area
- Runoff is diverted away from all feedlots, manure storage areas, and barnyards within WQMAs.
- There is self-sustaining sod or vegetative cover adequate to preserve streambank or lakeshore integrity in areas where livestock have access.
- Manure Storage Facilities have no visible signs of leakage or failure.
- Manure Storage Facilities are maintained to prevent overflow.
- Each storage facility that has not had manure added or removed from the facility for a period of 24 months has either been closed in a manner that will prevent future contamination of ground or surface water or has been approved by DNR for continued use
- Facilities constructed or substantially altered after 2002 meet the NRCS 313 standard
- There are no significant discharges of process wastewater to waters of the state from feed storage or other sources.
- There are no channels or other visible signs of significant discharge from a feedlot or stored manure into waters of the state.
