

ATCP 50 & LANDOWNERS AND PRODUCERS

Provides the framework to cost-share conservation practices including NM plans

Describes the parameters for grants for conservation practices

Identifies the costs to be included in cost-share grants to landowners

Identifies conservation practice standards available for cost-sharing

ATCP 50 & COUNTY CONSERVATION

Defines the requirements for a land and water resource management plan

Establishes the process and priorities for allocating grants to support county conservation efforts

Describes conservation compliance requirements for the farmland preservation program

ATCP 50 & SOIL AND WATER PROFESSIONALS

Describes the process to certify conservation engineering practioners

Establishes qualifications for nutrient management planners

Allows for certification of soil and manure testing laboratories

Ensures access to education and training opportunities

Overview of Administrative Rulemaking Process

Statement of Scope

- Stakeholder input
- Preparation by agency staff
- Gubernatorial approval
- Publication in Administrative Register
- Possible public hearing and comment
- Approval by ATCP Board

Initial Drafting

- Stakeholder input
- Initial drafting of rule by agency staff
- Preparation of Economic Impact and Regulatory Flexibility Analysis
- •Small business review

External Reviews

- Review by LWCB
- •Review by Legislative Council Staff
- Approval by DATCP
 Board for public hearing
- Public hearings and public comment period

Final Agency Review

- Agency responses to Legislative Council reviews and public comment
- Draft rule revisions and final drafting
- ATCP Board approval
- •Gubernatorial approval

Legislative Review

- •Referral to standing committees
- •30-day standing committee passive review
- •30-day JCRAR passive review
- Opportunities for legislative objections

Publication

- Secretary certifies rule
- Agency submits to Legislative Reference Bureau (LRB)
- •Formatting and publication by LRB
- •Rule usually takes effect on day after publication

~Time in stage: 12-18 months

~Time in stage:4 months

~Time in stage: 3 months

~Time in stage: 2 months

Total time to get to Legislature from scope approval may not exceed 30 months







OBJECTIVE I: SILURIAN BEDROCK AGRICULTURAL PERFORMANCE STANDARD (NR 151.075)

Review conservation practices to meet soil and water standards

Identifies strategies to meet the technical challenges of conservation

Review of grant programs, priorities and requirements

Review requirements for technical assistance for producers, landowners and service providers

Provide education and training on conservation topics

Coordinate soil and water conservation planning and activities



TOPICS FOR DISCUSSION

Review requirements, eligibility and costs/rates related to cost-sharing

Review thresholds for recording and bidding

Review percentage allowed to pay for engineering services

Clarify length of costshare requirements (4 yrs; 10 yrs) and requirements

Review cost-share rate for non-ag practices

Consider incentive payments as allowable use of funds

Review eligible costs

Review conservation practices and update or add practices if necessary

Review application and reporting requirements for counties

Update certification and training provisions
